Subject: C-47 aircraft

Back in July of 1967 I worked as a technical writer for a firm out of Chicago who sent me to a branch out of North Ft. Lauderdale to work on a project for the Air Force. I was handed a Mil. Spec. 1 1/2 inches thick and 800 mechanical drawings of the C-47 aircraft and asked to find areas of the aircraft where they can insert things without being detrimental to the aircraft. I assumed the obvious, i.e. modern avionics, Dopler Antennas, and other modern avionics, etc. The largest blueprint was a J size...the full aircraft, and all other drawings down to an A size. I was given a month to produce my analysis and spent more than 8-hour days to finish the project in 3 weeks. I showed where they could insert whatever into the body of the plane.

I thought often about what was done with my findings. I recently revisited the subject out of curiosity and found that in 1969 it operated as a gunship in Viet Nam known as "Puff the Magic Dragon."

I was happy to discover that my efforts helped the war effort even though I was no longer in the Corps.
